## THE PRESENTATIONS

INSTRUCTIONAL LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

In this talk, Dr. Harris will look at the difficulties and challenges and yet always the necessity of self-care and self-maintenance in analytic functioning.

Drawing from relational theory, current ideas about embodiment, enactment, and contemporary work on countertransference, Dr. Harris will look at ways to think about analytic functioning in clinical circumstances both ordinary and extraordinary. Participants are encouraged to bring their own clinical vignettes. Case material will be part of the presentation. Dr. Harris is particularly interested in understanding impasse as an aspect of the analyst's disruptions and countertransference.

## THE PRESENTER

**Adrienne Harris, Ph.D.** is Faculty and Supervisor at New York University Postdoctoral Program in Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis. She is on the faculty and is a supervisor at the Psychoanalytic Institute of Northern California. She is a member and Training Analyst in the IPA. She is an Editor at Psychoanalytic Dialogues, and Studies In Gender and Sexuality. In 2009, She, Lewis Aron, and Jeremy Safron established the Sandor Ferenczi Center at the New School University.

Her book *Gender as Soft Assembly* was published in 2005 and issued in paperback in 2009. She has a new book, co-edited with Steve Botticelli, *First Do No Harm: The Paradoxical Encounters of Psychoanalysis, Warmaking, and Resistance*. (2010).

She has written on topics in gender and development, analytic subjectivity and self-care, primitive states and the analytic community in the shadow of the First World War. Her current work is on analytic subjectivity, and on ghosts.
