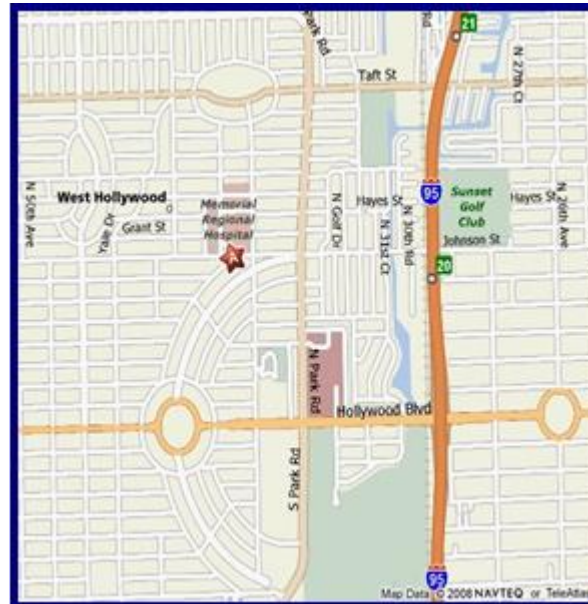
THE LOCATION

Susan P. Sherkow, M.D., is a Training and Supervising Analyst at the Berkshire Psychoanalytic Institute and a Supervising Analyst and Instructor in the Child and Adolescent Division of the New York Psychoanalytic Institute. She is an Adjunct Clinical Professor in Psychiatry at Mount Sinai

College of Medicine, and an Associate Clinical Professor in Psychiatry at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine. Dr. Sherkow has published in JAPA and in the Psychoanalytic Study of the Child, among others, on the topics of primal scene, infantile eating disorders, diagnosis of sexual abuse in young children, and watched play. She has published in the Psychoanalytic Inquiry on the topics of autism spectrum disorder and of working in analysis with children under five. She is the co-author of Autism Spectrum Disorder: Perspectives from Psychoanalysis and Neuroscience, written with Alexandra M. Harrison with contributions by William M. Singletery, and is a contributing author to Disordered Thought, by Theodore Fallon.

THE PRESENTATION

INSTRUCTIONAL LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

The purpose of this presentation is to illustrate the application of a psychoanalytic approach to development and therapy with young children and how it can impact the treatment of a toddler on the spectrum. Participants will be able to understand the interplay between neurobiology, neuro-function, and a psychodynamic perspective, and how that interplay influences our understanding of ASD in young children and informs our methodology in treating a toddler and his mother. Participants will be able to understand how the biologically-based symptoms of ASD impact aspects of social, emotional, and cognitive development, and how play techniques can be applied as an adjunct to an overall treatment plan for an ASD child. **Attendees are encouraged to come prepared for the Q&A portion of this program with examples from their clinical practice or personal lives.**
